WHEREAS: Congress is beginning consideration of the President's three-part economic recovery plan with the 1994 budget resolution and, then the short term economic stimulus plan as early as next week; and

WHEREAS: This plan, especially the economic stimulus plan, is "taking a lot of heat" according to House Speaker Tom Foley and was supported last week by the National League of Cities because of its importance to the people of our country's cities; and

WHEREAS: This plan is so important to creating jobs in general, to creating summer jobs for youth, and to making improvements in the infrastructure; and

WHEREAS: The stimulus plan includes very important programs for Cambridge, such as an additional \$2.2 million in community development block grant funds; summer youth training money, chapter 1 summer program funds for education for disadvantaged students, and transportation funds; and

WHEREAS: There is a real danger that the program will not get through Congress if the present momentum is not maintained; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council, recognizing that there are no panaceas and sustained efforts will be required, endorses the President's plan for restarting our economy, real deficit reduction, and long-term investment and urges the Congress to adopt a budget resolution by April 2, setting forth the blueprint; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council recognizes that all of us must join together in reshaping federal spending priorities to ensure economic security for future generations; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to be sent to Congressman Kennedy and Senators Kennedy and Kerry, requesting their help and support in solving these difficult problems through support of President Clinton's efforts.
