TO THE CITY COUNCIL OF CAMBRIDGE:

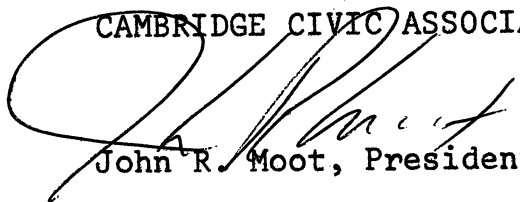
THE CAMBRIDGE CIVIC ASSOCIATION REQUESTS THAT THE CAMBRIDGE CITY COUNCIL ACTIVELY SUPPORT SENATE BILL NO. 370 WHICH IS:

AN ACT TO CONVERT COUNTY JAILS AND HOUSES OF CORRECTION INTO CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS OF THE COMMONWEALTH BY TRANSFERRING THEIR PROPERTY AND EMPLOYEES TO THE COMMONWEALTH AND DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION TO INTEGRATE THEIR FACILITIES INTO A UNITARY SYSTEM OF CRIMINAL CORRECTIONS AIMED AT REDUCING RECIDIVISM.
