IN CITY COUNCIL
June 12, 1989

WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge, by order of the City Council, has been a Sister City with San Jose Las Flores, El Salvador for three years, and has sent seven delegations of citizens to deliver food, medicines and good will; and

WHEREAS: In May, 1989, the Cambridge City Council and Mayor Alfred E. Vellucci, welcomed Manuel Cartegena, representative of the Town Council of San Jose Las Flores and president of the Coordinating Committee of the Department of Chalatenango, El Salvador, during his visit to Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: The Armed Forces of El Salvador have occupied San Jose Las Flores since May 29, 1989, taking over the Church and Convent, threatening the nuns, destroying the Child Care Center, interrogating every family, preventing people from leaving and entering the town; and

WHEREAS: The Armed Forces have singled out the family of Manuel Cartegena, who initiated the Sister City relationship with Cambridge, by destroying the home of his brother, Julio, and seizing his brother, Bertilio, and imprisoning him in another part of the country; and

WHEREAS: The United States government is sending 2 million dollars a day in military aid to supply the Salvadoran Armed Forces; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council deplores the armed attacks against civilians in San Jose Las Flores, other repopulated towns and all over El Salvador; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council praises Congressman Joseph Kennedy, for his consistent and courageous support of the people of Las Flores and for his recent sponsorship of the Kastenmeier Bill to end all military aid to El Salvador; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council endorses the platform and resolution passed by the Massachusetts Democratic State Convention on June 3, 1989, which calls on all Massachusetts Democrats and the Congressional delegation to work toward an end to all military aid to El Salvador and encourage citizens and communities to provide humanitarian aid to civilians in wartown areas.
