My Dear Sir:-

At a meeting of the Commissioners of Harvard Bridge this day at the Mayor's Office, the following order was adopted :--

"Ordered that a communication be sent to the Boards of Aldermen of Boston and Cambridge, notifying them that the work on the bridge has progressed to a point where it becomes necessary for the Commissioners to determine the character of the surface of the roadway, and make contracts therefor. That to do this, it is important for them to know what and where locations are to be for any railroad that may run over it. Unless this matter is soon determined, there must be considerable delay in completing and opening the bridge to travel."
