- WHEREAS:** It has come the attention of this City Council that an act of heroism was conducted by Firefighter Francis E. (Lucky) Holleran on June 27, 1981; and
- WHEREAS:** While off-duty Firefighter Holleran was visiting in the area of Mt. Pleasant Street when his attention was called to 51 Mount Pleasant Street where a fire broke and began to spread rapidly through the three-family structure; and
- WHEREAS:** Firefighter Holleran by way of natural instinct made his way to the second floor of the building, locating and assisting two people out of the building before the fire cut off their means of escape; and
- WHEREAS:** Once he was out of the building, Firefighter Holleran was advised that there were people on the third floor who could not make it down the stairs due to the smoke and fire, he quickly ran to a nearby truck, grabbed a thirty-two foot ladder and proceeded to go after the couple on the third floor; and
- WHEREAS:** Without consideration for his own life Firefighter Holleran proceeded to take both third floor occupants out of the building over the ladder to safety, making a total of four lives he saved in a matter of minutes; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That this City Council go on record extending its deep appreciation and gratitude to Firefighter Francis E. (Lucky) Holleran for his outstanding action above and beyond the call of duty and without regard for his own personal safety; and be it further
- RESOLVED:** That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Firefighter Holleran on behalf of the entire City Council and as well as to Fire Chief Daniel J. Reagan for inclusion in this man's personnel file.

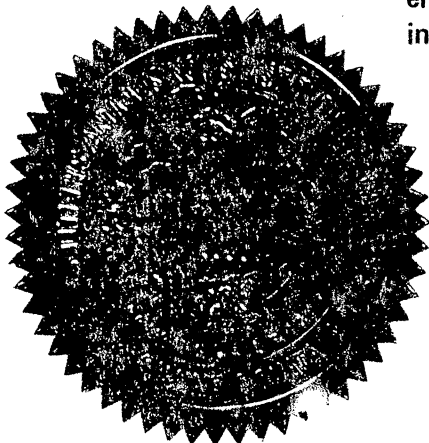
