- WHEREAS: The City Council Finance Subcommittee has recently met to review the state of the City's finances; and
- WHEREAS: The problems of decreasing revenue, both from the State of Massachusetts and from sources that include locally generated fees, permits, and taxes point to at least several years of fiscal restraint; and
- WHEREAS: Only with realistic expectations on the part of citizens and city employees will we be able to weather the coming storm with a minimum of pain and disruption, while maintaining the level of service that we have come to expect and appreciate; and
- WHEREAS: The citizens, city employees, and community leaders may be called on to work together to overturn state local aid policy, override Proposition 2 1/2, or find other innovative fiscal responses to our local problems; and
- WHEREAS: The sudden turn in financial circumstances have yet to make themselves apparent to the citizens of Cambridge, their elected, neighborhood, labor, or fraternal leaders; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That this City Council calls on the City Manager to work with the City Council Finance Committee, the School Committee, the Treasurers Office, Employee Unions, Neighborhood and community organizations, service providers, and others to convene a CITY SUMMIT ON THE STATE OF CAMBRIDGE FINANCES.

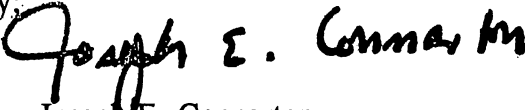
