

This means that property owners may pass the increase in real estate taxes onto the tenants by dividing the increase into the number of units in the building over a 12-month period.

While this was an across the board increase, property owners must apply individually for the rent increases to the Rent Control Board. Applications for rent increases will be available in the Rent Control office, at City Hall, on February 1.

Once the rent structure is established, the board will notify tenants of the increase.

Where a 30-day notice is required, rent increases are not expected to be

effective until April 1.

This is the second straight year that across the board increases were granted because of a more than \$30 increase in the local tax rate.


To the Honorable, the City Council:
