The City Council at a special meeting on August 7, 1969 failed to take affirmative action on the measure providing for a temporary rent control ordinance in the City of Cambridge as submitted to the City Council by initiative petition by Hilary Putnam, 49 Lee St., Margot Didley, 263 Putnam Ave. and William B. Cunningham, 151 Putnam Ave. in behalf of the Cambridge Rent Control Referendum Campaign.

The City Council proceeding under the requirements of Chapter 43, Section 40 adopted an order providing that such proposed measure without alteration be submitted to a vote of the registered voters of the City of Cambridge at the next Municipal Election.
