An Ordinance
in relation to Licenses.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of
Cambridge as follows:-

Sec. 1. Licenses granted to keepers of intelligence
offices, dealers in furs, old metals, and second-
hand articles, pawnbrokers, and keepers of billiard-
saloons and bowling-alleys, shall, unless sooner
revoked, continue in force, until the first day of
May next ensuing.

Sec. 2. All ordinances and parts of ordinances
inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.
