WHEREAS: Employees of the Boston Gas Company Local 12003 U.S.W.A., AFL-CIO have been "locked out" since January 24, 1993; and

WHEREAS: These employees have expressed their willingness to work without a contract as long as negotiations are ongoing; and

WHEREAS: These employees have modified their proposals and tried to negotiate in good faith; and

WHEREAS: Boston Gas Company officials have not changed their original position and have refused to negotiate in good faith; and

WHEREAS: The thirty-inch in diameter intermediate pressure main lines owned by Boston Gas Company run under the asphalt from the banks of the Charles River, down River Street next to City Hall, and up Inman Street to Inman Square; and

WHEREAS: Due to the strike, Boston Gas has sub-contracted the critical and exacting job of marking out these gas mains; now therefore be it

~~RESOLVED:~~ That, I Kenneth E. Reeves, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, urges the City of Boston not pay any bills to the Boston Gas Company until there is an end to the Lockout of Local 12003 U.S.W.A., AFL-CIO and negotiations resume in good faith.

Whereas: Members of Local 12003 are Cambridge residents with young families to support
