Subject Parking and Traffic Conditions in the Strawberry Hill Neighborhood.

This is a progress report on those recommendations which were approved by the Neighborhood Residents on March 27, 1979.

1. Speeding

The Police Department was notified of the neighborhoods concern of speeding cars especially on Huron Ave. and of the legal 25 MPH posted Speed Limit.

2. Parking on Huron Ave.

Due to the number of complaints both pro and con concerning a proposed parking restriction on this street we are meeting with various agencies and will be discussing this matter with the neighborhood at a later date.

3. Pavement Markings

Due to the trucking problem and that the paint we use is an oil base we did not receive our paint order (3 months late) until last Friday, June 22. We will continue painting in this area.

4. Signing

All the signing in this area is completed.

5. Traffic Signals

The Traffic Signal installation at Huron Ave. and Holworthy St. has been redesigned and has been submitted to the State to be reconstructed under the Urban Systems Program.

6. Channelization

The plans are almost complete of the channelization of the intersections of Cushing St. and Huron Ave. and Fountain Terrace and Huron Ave. We will be meeting with the neighborhood group to review these plans in the very near future.



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7. Resident Parking Program

As requested by the neighborhood we are implementing the Resident Parking Program in this area by request only. At the present time the only requests we have had are from Fairview Ave. and Oxford Ave.

8. Park Ave.

A postcard survey has been completed concerning the making of Park Ave. a one-way street. The results were that the residents would like to keep the street a two-way street.

9. Golf Course Parking Lot

The Traffic Department is studying the parking lot on the Golf Course to try and find ways to accommodate more parkers off-street with the least amount of disruption to the athletic facilities.
