Thank you for contacting me about the nuclear weapons freeze and reductions resolution I have introduced in the House along with Representative Silvio Conte (R-MA).

I appreciate learning of your support for this measure. So far, more than 160 Representatives have signed on as co-sponsors of the resolution. In the Senate, where the same resolution has been introduced by Senators Kennedy and Hatfield, more than 20 Senators have endorsed the nuclear freeze and reduction resolution.

It is clear that the call from the grass roots for a halt to the arms race is being heard in Congress. Your support in this movement is important, and I hope you will continue to make your views known not only to me but to other Members of Congress and to President Reagan.
