I am hereby requesting an appropriation of \$17,622.00 in the Grant Fund of the Department of Human Service Programs Salary and Wages Account (\$15,504.00), Other Ordinary Maintenance Account (\$558.00), and Travel and Training Account (\$1,560.00).
