WHEREAS: Cambridge wishes to recognize the steps made toward democratic government since the coup was ended; and

WHEREAS: The citizens of Cambridge wish to continue their support for economic and political development in Haiti which benefits all its citizens; and

WHEREAS: Cambridge appreciates and celebrates its large and dynamic Haitian community; and

WHEREAS: Mr. Vasco Thernelan, the Vice President of the Chamber of Deputies of Haiti is currently visiting Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: A severe drought currently exists in the home province of Mr. Thernelan; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City of Cambridge gives an official welcome to the Vice President of the Chamber of Deputies of Haiti, Mr. Vasco Thernelan, from the Commune of Bombardopolis; and be it further

RESOLVED: That Cambridge urges the U.S. Government to give humanitarian aid to drought stricken areas of Haiti and development aid to the country as a whole without precondition, in line with the democratic will of the people of Haiti.
