A BILL FURTHER PROVIDING FOR THE
COMMITMENT OF ALCOHOLICS

Insert after the third sentence of the second paragraph of chapter 123, section 35.

Upon presentation of such a petition, if there is a reason to believe that the alleged alcoholic person will not appear upon a summons, a justice may issue a warrant for the apprehension and appearance before him of the alleged alcoholic person, if in his judgment the condition or conduct of such person makes such action necessary and proper. No arrest shall be made on such an expedited warrant unless the person may be presented immediately before a judge of the district court. V

Amend the first sentence of the third paragraph by striking the word "fifteen" and inserting in place thereof the word "thirty."
