

Whenever the superintendent of streets is about to construct a new street, or to break up the surface of any public way, he shall, at least two weeks before beginning work, notify the city engineer, as head of the sewer department, the Superintendent of lamps and the water board.

If either of these departments has any work to be done in the street or way so designated, it shall consult and arrange with the said superintendent of streets, in order that such work may be done before the surface of such street or way is again prepared for and opened to public travel. After such notice and opportunity have been

given, neither of the said three departments of sewers, lamps, or water shall for the space of six months, break up said street or way within the area of such previous

disturbance, except in case of obvious necessity, to be certified to and approved by the mayor. No street or

public way shall be opened by drain-layers or others
