Resolved: That the City Council go on record urging everyone to bring to their dancing shoes to City hall at 7 PM on Friday June 19th for the city's 3rd annual block party which will feature dancing to the music of DJ Joey Demers and will this year include a light show built around the theme of fish.

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Whereas: Cambridge is the second densest city in the Commonwealth, the sixth densest in the United States, meaning that there is less open space per resident than in all but one other city in Massachusetts, all but five in the United States, and

Whereas: Eastern parts of the city, East Cambridge, Area 4, Cambridgeport and Riverside have even less open space per resident than other parts of the city, putting great stress in the form of heavy use on playing fields, tot lots and parks, and

Whereas: Every square foot of open space lost in the city for construction of city projects, even those which fill very important social and educational needs, is a loss to all citizens and moves Cambridge closer to the dubious distinction of having the least amount of open space per resident in the whole country, therefore be it

Ordered: That the City Council go on record in favor of adopting a policy that will require the City Manager identify and initiate a compensating purchase of open space to offset any loss of open space which may be incurred in the building of public projects and be it further *significant*

Ordered: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to consult with the appropriate departments to draft such a policy for formal implementation by the Council.

*This Year's Annual Block Party will feature a light show and have a theme of fish to be held on June 19, 1998.*
