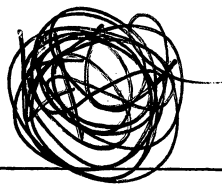

**DAVE BLANK**  
ANDOVER

A senior right-hander, Blank led Andover to the Division 1 state championship this year. He was 7-1 with a 1.46 ERA, and was named the Merrimack Valley Conference's Most Valuable Player. In addition, he batted .456. His career record at Andover was 13-2 over the last two springs, including five one-hitters. He will take his talents on the diamond to the University of South Florida in the fall.



**DOUG CARROLL**  
HOLLISTON

Perhaps the finest hitter in the state, Carroll produced some awe-inspiring numbers. He batted .625 (40-for-64) in his final high school season, raising his career average to .503. He finished the 1991 season with four homers, 28 RBI, 43 runs scored and 20 stolen bases. A center fielder and pitcher, he was drafted by the Red Sox in the fifth round of this year's baseball draft. He has also been accepted to the University of South Florida.



**ADAM CASTLE**  
STONEHAM

TAUNTON

Only a junior, DeMoura has two very solid varsity seasons under his belt. After posting a .636 average for the jayvees as a freshman, he has batted .401 and .507 in his first two varsity campaigns. A shortstop, he knocked in 34 runs and stole 23 bases this spring, helping Taunton to a 21-3 record. DeMoura is a two-time Old Colony League All-Star and was selected to the Eastern Mass. All-Star team. He also plays football.



**MATT FERULLO**  
REVERE

The Most Valuable Player in the Greater Boston League this spring, Ferullo dominated the GBL both at the plate and on the mound. As a pitcher, he was 7-1 with a 1.82 ERA, and struck out 68 batters in just 57 innings. He walked just 18. As a hitter, he batted .482 and clubbed eight home runs while driving in 34 runs. A 6-foot-5 senior, Ferullo is an Eastern Mass. All-Star and a USA District 1 All-Star. He will attend Michigan.



**STEVE GRENHAM**  
NORWOOD

A three-sport athlete, Grenham was captain of both the basketball and golf teams at Norwood. A shortstop in the spring, he batted .550, helping Norwood to the Bay State League title and the Division 1 South Sectional championship. A two-year Bay State League All-Star, Grenham was selected to the Eastern Mass. All-Star team. A class officer and member of Student Council, he will attend Brandeis University.



**JOE GUARINO**  
DOM SAVIO

BEVERLY

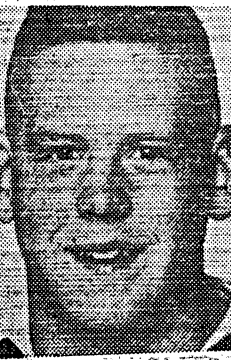

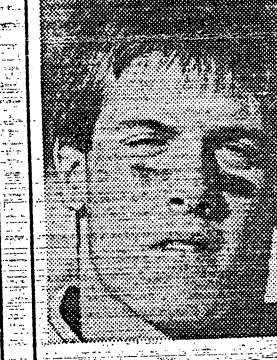
**MIKE MCGOWAN**
