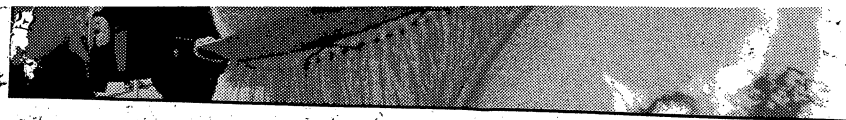

Channel 98, the Cambridge Public Schools cable channel, begins its summer schedule with a new series, "Matt Dunphy Talks With..." in which Cambridge Rindge and Latin School senior Matt Dunphy chats with politicians from the State House to the City Council.
