John E. Markey, at 89, manager for H.P. Hood

John E. Markey of Malden, former assistant manager of Hood's foods division and father of U.S. Rep. Edward J. Markey, died Thursday at Massachusetts General Hospital. He was 89.

Born in Dover, N.H., he attended Lawrence High School.

Mr. Markey was employed as an assistant manager of an A&P store in Lawrence and later became manager of an A&P in Malden.

He also owned the Pioneer Market in West Medford.

Mr. Markey served as a munitions specialist for R.H. White Co. and was president of the United Electrical Workers union local before joining the H.P. Hood Co. of Charlestown where he was employed as a milkman and later as a sales representative and supervisor. He retired as assistant manager of the foods division of Hood in Boston.

Mr. Markey was a parishioner of Immaculate Conception Church in Malden and its Holy Name Society and a member of the board of directors at Nazareth Foods Association — a children's philanthropic organization.

He was also a coordinator of the fund-raising efforts to build a new Immaculate Conception Church which was completed in 1963.

Mr. Markey established the Christina M. (Courtney) Markey Scholarship in memory of his wife who died of complications of Alzheimer's Disease in 1998.
