That the Supt. of Public Buildings be and hereby is ordered to place the necessary articles as are ordinarily used for such purposes, in the lavatory in this City Council chamber.

Whereas, in the near future the United States Government, through its official, will remove the temporary buildings on Cambridge Common, and whereas,

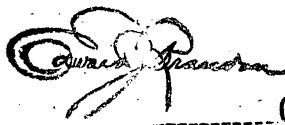
