WHEREAS:

A communication has been received from His Honor the Mayor notifying the City Council of the death of Thomas F. Atkinson, it is fitting that official notice be taken of his passing away.

Mr. Atkinson was for over sixty years a resident of Cambridge. In his early youth he entered the retail shoe business in East Cambridge, later embarking for himself in the wholesale trade. He built up a substantial business by his untiring efforts and was actively engaged until shortly before his death. He was a highly respected citizen with a reputation for integrity that extended throughout every State in the Union. He was a member of many social and fraternal organizations and, in 1914, became a member of the Board of Library Trustees which position he held until 1917. His time and talents were always at the disposal of his fellow citizens and he served on many important civic committees during and after the war. It is therefore

RESOLVED:

That we recognize the loss the city has sustained in the death of Thomas F. Atkinson and recommend that these resolutions be spread upon the records of the City Council.

To the Honorable, the City Council:

It is my sad duty to officially call your attention to the death of Mr. Thomas F. Atkinson, 70 Fresh Pond Parkway, which occurred at his home in this city on Monday, December 21, 1931. Mr. Atkinson was a member of the Board of Public Library Trustees from 1914 to 1917 inclusive, and served faithfully and intelligently on this board in behalf of his fellow citizens.

Mr. Atkinson, too, was a well known business man, an old and respected citizen of Cambridge who never lost interest in public affairs. He always responded generously, and served on many semi-public committees when called upon. At the time of his death he was a member of our Cambridge Unemployment Relief Committee.

In view of his public service I respectfully recommend that suitable action be taken by your honorable board as a tribute of respect to his memory, in which action I shall be pleased to join.

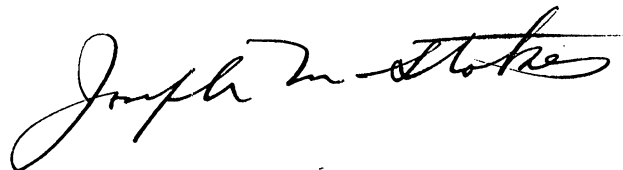
