Provided however that not more than one half the expense for watering any one street shall be paid from the City Treasury.

year, be divided among the Wards as follows, viz: For Ward One, the
sum of Five Hundred and Seventy Five Dollars; for Ward Two the
sum of Seven Hundred Dollars; for Ward Three the sum of Four
Hundred and Twenty Five Dollars; and that whenever a sum
amounting to not less than ^{of five hundred} fifty dollars shall be contributed by
the inhabitants of any part of the city for the purpose of watering
any particular street, ~~and when a satisfactory certificate is
made to the Corporation by the street
owners that the sum has been paid into the hands of the Surveysor
of Highways into a statement to that effect,~~ an equal amount shall
be added thereto from the aforesaid appropriation, and the
whole shall be expended under the direction of the Surveysor
of Highways; Provided, however, that not more than one
hundred dollars shall be appropriated to any street be-
fore the first day of July; and the amount remaining un-
appropriated at that date shall be divided among the
applicants in proportion to the sums raised by them.
