CITY OF CAMBRIDGE

In the Year One Thousand, Nine Hundred Eighty-Four
AN ORDINANCE

In amendment to an ordinance formerly entitled "The General Ordinances
of the City of Cambridge" as revised in 1972 and now designated as "The
Code of the City of Cambridge."

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows:

Chapter Thirteen, entitled "OFFENSES" is hereby amended by striking out
in their entirety the present section 13-2 entitled "Injuring or destroying
public property" of Article I entitled "OFFENSES AGAINST PROPERTY," and
the present section 13-18 entitled "Penalty for violation" of Article VII en-
titled "PENALTY" and inserting in place thereof the following new sections,
which read as follows:

Sec. 13-2. Injuring, destroying or trespassing on public property.

No person shall, without proper authority, paint on, write on, or otherwise
injure, deface, destroy or vandalize any public building or any public prop-
erty. Nor shall any person trespass on the roof of a public building or within a
school building after regular school hours without the prior permission of a
duly authorized public official.

At least two signs shall be posted on all public buildings with not less than
one inch letters, not more than 10 feet, and not less than 6 feet from the
ground, black letters on white background as follows:

City of Cambridge
No Trespassing and
No Defacing of this public building.
Violators will be prosecuted to the
full extent of the law.
City Manager

Any person who violates any provision of this section shall be subject to a
fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the first offense,
not more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the second offense and not
more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for subsequent offenses.

Sec. 13-18. Penalty for violation.

Unless otherwise specified, any person who violates any provision of this
Chapter shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each
offense.
