The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY- ONE

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE TO LIMIT THE EXPANSION OF TAX EXEMPT ORGANIZATIONS IN SAID CITY.

As delayed implementation could tend to defeat the purpose of this act, it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public safety and convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. It is hereby declared that the city of Cambridge is in a serious financial crisis, which is caused in part by the severe erosion of its tax base, and that evidence of this erosion is provided by the fact that approximately forty-six percent of the land in Cambridge is tax exempt.

SECTION 2. In order that the city of Cambridge may stop the severe erosion of its tax base by limiting the location and expansion of tax exempt organizations in said city, Cambridge may provide by ordinance that no real estate in Cambridge may attain tax exempt status by virtue of its being purchased by or held in trust for a charitable organization, as defined in clause third, section five of chapter fifty-nine of the General Laws, without a permit for such status first being obtained from the

Cambridge City Council.

This act shall take effect upon its passage.

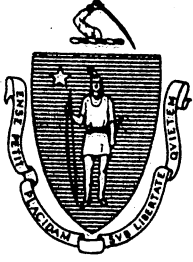
