WHEREAS:

Members of the speech pathology and audiology profession strive to restore or improve communicative competence so that those with speech, language, or hearing disorders can regain and maintain a meaningful and productive place in our society, and

WHEREAS:

The City of Cambridge is aware of and grateful for the high level of speech pathology and audiology services available to communicatively handicapped persons in schools, rehabilitation centers, hospitals, speech and hearing clinics and private practice offices, therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That I, Walter J. Sullivan, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, do hereby proclaim May, 1975, as "Better Hearing and Speech Month" in Cambridge and I commend and endorse the humanitarian and rehabilitative services rendered by speech pathologists and audiologists throughout the city to our communicatively impaired citizens.
