WHEREAS:

Vincent L. Kelley was a life long resident of Cambridge who compiled an outstanding record as a star athlete at Rindge Technical School and St. John's Prep in Andover during the period from 1919 to 1924, and

WHEREAS:

Vincent L. Kelley was an expert in the field of masonry construction who was honored by his election as Treasurer of the Brick Layers and Mason's Union for twenty-five years and served the City of Cambridge as Clerk of the Works in the construction of the Harrington School, Morse School, Fitzgerald School and the War Memorial, and

WHEREAS:

Vincent L. Kelley by virtue of his long experience in the construction field became an invaluable member of the Building Department in his capacity of Inspector of Buildings from December, 1964 until the time of his passing on February 12, 1974 at the age of sixty-eight, therefore be it

That in the passing of Vincent L. Kelley the City of Cambridge has lost an able dedicated official who exemplified the highest standards of public service and won the respect and admiration of all who came in contact with him, and be it further
