Subject City Council Order #4 of June 22, 1987 "Crosswalk at Huron Towers".

The reason there is no crosswalk at the Huron Towers to cross Huron Avenue is that it is very dangerous to cross at that location as it is at the foot of a hill and the visibility is very poor.

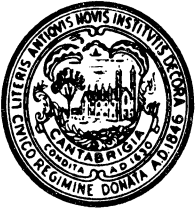
The other reason for not allowing a crossing at this location is that if you did cross Huron Avenue at this location there is no access to the golf course and with no sidewalk on that side of the street, pedestrians would have to walk up the street to the entrance to the golf course.

It is therefore much safer to walk up Huron Avenue on the sidewalk and then cross to the golf course where there is a crosswalk and the visibility is better.
