WHEREAS: A Special Committee of the City Council was appointed by the Mayor in September of 1992 to address the issue of the citing of CASPAR; and

WHEREAS: This Committee was comprised of sixteen members plus two ex-officer members; and

WHEREAS: Members of this Committee represented the many diverse and active parties concerned about the siting of CASPAR, including neighborhood groups, businesses, CASPAR, the clergy, Massachusetts Institute of Technology and the City; and

WHEREAS: During the course of the six months the Committee met in twenty-five meetings, working to bring a sense of unity and consensus to this situation, ensuring that public input was incorporated into the final resolution; and

WHEREAS: On March 1st of this year the Committee presented a resolution which was adopted by an 8-1 vote of the City Council which brought a resolution to a fourteen year issue for the City of Cambridge, now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Mayor and the City Council go on record commending members of the Special Committee for their work on this issue; and be it further

RESOLVED: That all parties, including the Special Committee, neighborhood groups, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, CASPAR, and the City be congratulated; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City's residents join in wishing the best for CASPAR as they work toward moving into a new home.
