WHEREAS: The Parks Project of the Longfellow-Neighborhood Council has been trying to improve the quality of parks and tot-lots in Mid-Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: These active citizens require and deserve city assistance in their efforts; therefore, be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager:

1. Request the dog officer, police, and others to enforce the dog laws at the Wilder Playground (corner of Lee and West Streets), where dogs are being allowed to run free within the fence surrounding the playground and to deposit waste which prevents children from playing; and
2. Request the Traffic Department to install a flashing caution signal, or other appropriate traffic device or signs, at the corner of Hancock and Centre Streets, to protect children crossing these streets to and from the Cooper Playground;

and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager report to the City Council the results of these requests.
