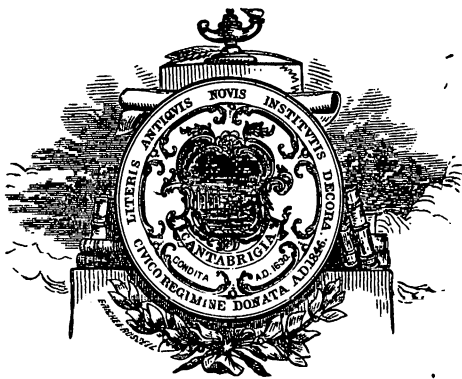

surveying, and dated Oct. 19. 1887,

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that ^{no} damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid, the
several owners and abutters on said Brewster Street, having
waived the usual notice and agreed to claim no
damages for account of such laying out.
