- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that a potentially dangerous situation was averted through the quick and professional response of the Police Department; and
- WHEREAS: A young man armed with a shotgun fired several times at police in the early morning hours of Wednesday, June 4, 1980 holding off police for more than three hours; and
- WHEREAS: The first two police officers on the scene, James Dwyer and James Hite, exercised extreme calm, intelligence and foresight by properly assessing the situation before they notified their superior officers and evacuated the building; and
- WHEREAS: Both the uniformed men led by Captain Henry Breen and the Detectives led by Lieutenant Edwin Peterson, although too numerous to mention individually, performed in an exemplary manner, many of whom put their own lives in jeopardy to prevent a tragedy from happening; and
- WHEREAS: Through the combined efforts of all of these men, the suspect was captured without the police firing a single shot and without any being injured; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending our sincere appreciation and congratulations to Captain Henry Breen, Lieutenant Edwin Peterson and Police Officers James Dwyer, James Hite and all the uniformed men and detectives who worked together to avert a tragedy; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Captain Henry Breen, Lieutenant Edwin Peterson, Police Officers James Dwyer and James Hite, Detective Sergeant Dominic Scalese, Sergeant Timothy Lane, Sergeant Richard Cahill, Sergeant Dennis McCarthy, Sergeant Thomas Benson, Detective James Roscoe and Police Officers Robert Ames, Robert Harvey, Richard Hoxie, Joseph Ferreira, James Sugrue, Jr., and Charles Santos for their devotion to duty.

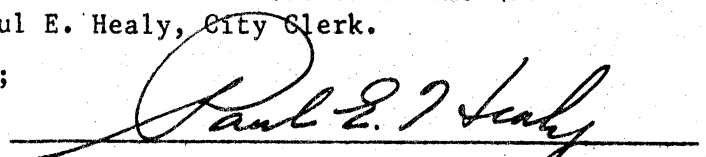
