Samuel B. Goldstein, 89, honored for war service

Samuel B. Goldstein of Quincy, a retired general manager, died Sunday at his residence after a lengthy illness. He was 89.

Mr. Goldstein was a lifelong resident of Quincy. He graduated from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1933 with a degree in Aeronautical Engineering.

He was an Army veteran of World War II, and served as lieutenant colonel of the Air Transport Command of the Army Air Forces.

In 2000, Mr. Goldstein was honored by U.S. Sen. Edward M. Kennedy's office for his service during World War II.

Mr. Goldstein was the general

manager at his family business, Goldie's Inc., in Quincy, until his retirement in 1984.

He was a former member of Temple Beth El and Adath Shalom, both in Quincy.

Mr. Goldstein is survived by his wife, Irene D.; four daughters, Barbara Krock of Dover, Jean Holz of Virginia, Nancy Kramer of New York and Debra Hart of Newton; a son, Barry Hart of Arizona; seven grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

A funeral service will be held at noon today at Levine Chapel, Brookline.
