During the summer months, the Fresh Pond Golf Course was the target of a number of vandalisms. Most of these incidents took place at night when the course was not in use.

In order to prevent this from happening again, several preventative measures have been taken by the Cambridge Police Department.

All sector and one-man cruisers in the area of Fresh Pond make regular passes through the area. The times are recorded on the Officer's activity. The Patrol Sergeant in charge also checks the area as often as possible. Also, night detectives working in unmarked vehicles have been paying close attention to the Fresh Pond Golf Course.

The Cambridge Police Department will continue to keep a close watch on this area in an effort to prevent any further acts of vandalism.

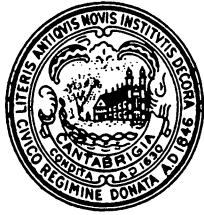

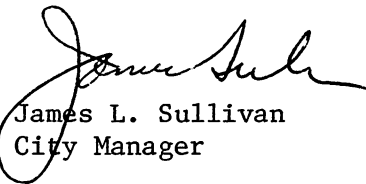
