Dear Sir,

I must ask that the
City take measures for the
obtaining of water henceforth
from some other source
than the Ditch upon the Estate
of the late S. J. Dana, and
that the structures built by
the City be removed and
the premises left substan-
tially as they were before
the City entered upon them
at some time previously
to the twenty eighth day of

Apr 10 Current.

I have fully considered the
suggestion previously made by
you relative to the removal
of the tank & pump to the
lower end of the ditch and
find it to be impracticable.

This Indenture made the tenth day of May
in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred
and sixty-six, Witnesseth That Ezekiel W.
Allen, of Cambridge in the County of Middlesex and
Commonwealth of Massachusetts, doth lease, dem-
ise and let into the City of Cambridge a certain
parcel of land situate on the southerly side of West-
ern Avenue, in said Cambridge, adjoining the edge
of his other land, sufficiently large for the accom-
modation and use of the Watering Tank of said
City the precise spot to be designated by mutual
agreement at the execution hereof.

To hold for the term of Five years from the
day of the date hereof, yielding and paying
therefor the rent of Twenty-five Dollars in each
and every year.

And the said Lessee doth promise to pay the
said rent annually during the said term, and
also for such further time as the Lessee may
hold the premises.

Know all Men That I, Isaac Tibbets, of
Cambridge, in the County of Middlesex and Com-
monwealth of Massachusetts, hereby promise and
agree to and with the City of Cambridge that I
will water the streets named in a certain Sched-
ule now in the hands of the Committee on Water-
ing Streets, for and during the season ending
with the last day of September next, with
soft water, to the satisfaction of said Com-
mittee.

In consideration whereof, said City of Cam-
bridge hereby promises and agrees to pay to
said Tibbets the sum of Two Thousand
Two Hundred and Twenty-two Dollars and
forty-nine cents, to wit, the sum of \$1610.50
from the subscriptions for said watering and
the sum of \$611.99 from the City Appropria-
tion thereof.

In witness whereof the said Isaac Tibbets
has hereunto set his hand, and the said City
of Cambridge has caused its corporate name to
be hereunto subscribed by Ezra Parmenter,
