COUNCILLOR WALSH

WHEREAS: That the recent weekend snow and ice storm followed by the severe freeze provoked strong reactions among those involved in the snow removal process and city residents impacted by it was made clear by the numerous telephone calls received by City Council members and other city officials; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That in an effort to lower the level of frustration for both snow removal crews and residents, it is the sense of this City Council that the City Manager set in place, as soon as possible, a permanent policy whereby in future snowstorms when the snow depth has reached a level of two inches, a SNOW EMERGENCY be declared in the City of Cambridge so that plowing and treatment of thoroughfares marked as EMERGENCY ARTERY can begin immediately and not delayed until very late in or some time after the storm has ended. Further, that in rain/ice-mix situations, treatment of road surfaces begin as soon as possible; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager report back to the City Council on this resolution within one week.
