The United States Labor Party, running Lyndon H. LaRouche for President and H. Graham Lowry for Senate requests of the Cambridge City Council permission to hold sound rallies for the LaRouche and Lowry Campaigns. The United States Labor Party has been organizing support in the Cambridge area for some time and ran a candidate in the last congressional race in the 8th district who received some 12 to 18% of the vote.

The United States Labor Party is requesting an open or periodically renewable permit for sound rallies. The current requirement in the City which calls for a separate permit for every rally would inhibit the ability of the U.S. Labor Party to campaign in Cambridge as such campaign rallies are subject to changes in weather, changes in the candidates schedules, and other last minute things. An open permit for sound rallies would allow the U.S. Labor Party the flexibility necessary to conduct a campaign in this city.
