To the members of the Cambridge City Council.

I would like to present my opinion to all of you regarding the increased rates for residential parking stickers in the City of Cambridge.

I am a homeowner as well as a life long resident of the City of Cambridge. I have paid Property and Excise Taxes to this City for a great number of years. When it was brought to my attention that I would have to pay an increased rate for a residential parking permit to park in front of my own home, I was appalled. This increase has doubled and for additional cars owned, it has tripled.

I feel these increases are unjustified so I made a phone call to City Hall in an attempt to find an answer as to why these increases are taking place. I was informed that the increases were to promote Bicycle riding rather than automobile driving in the City. This is the most ridiculous solution I have ever heard. Would it be possible for young mothers to transport several children to and from school? Would it be possible for our elderly to ride a bicycle back and forth to doctor's appointments?

I view this explanation as absurd and I feel I deserve a better educational answer!

The residential parking situation throughout the City has been a problem for years. Sometimes, after working all day, a parking spot on the street is unavailable. To increase the rates for residential stickers creates more of a problem rather than a road toward a solution.

The City of Cambridge doesn't allow free or ample parking to its own non-residential employees. Now, us Cambridge Taxpayers and City Supporters face an equal problem that is not justified with a reasonable answer.

Surrounding City's Councilmen, such as Somerville, have struggled to keep residential parking rates at a minimum and have succeeded in doing so. What is the problem in our City that we have been unable to do the same? It has become obvious to me that our City's Councilmen have not been seeking to better the living situations for the residents of Cambridge.

I will do everything in my power to have my disappointment heard throughout the City. I will also take every avenue
