IN CITY COUNCIL

April 27, 1981

ORDERED: That in accordance with the provisions of an ordinance relative to placing and maintaining signs, the Commissioner of Public Works be and hereby is authorized to grant a permit to the Division of Land Use of the Massachusetts Department of Food and Agriculture for the erection of a banner across Massachusetts Avenue at the corner of Norfolk Street on Mondays from June 29th up to and including October 26, 1981 from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. for the purpose of holding a Farmers Market.

Provided that before erecting the above named banner the petitioner shall obtain a permit from the Building Department and file with the City Clerk a satisfactory bond in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) conditioned to save harmless the City of Cambridge from all claims for damages arising from the construction, maintenance and use of said banner; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to direct the Commissioner of Traffic and Parking to waive all parking fees for the meters within the parking lot located on Bishop Richard Allen Drive and Norfolk Street and the surrounding areas for the purpose of allowing consumers to participate in the Farmers Market during the period when the market is being conducted and to take whatever steps are necessary, including the posting of signs, to ensure that the intent of this order is being carried out.

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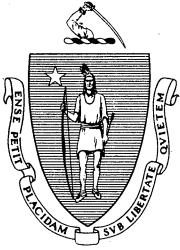

Dear Mr. Healy:

We thank the City of Cambridge for permission last year to suspend an informational street banner over Massachusetts Avenue and for suspension of city parking fees for the purpose of the Cambridge farmers market.

On behalf of the Cambridge community groups involved we petition the City of Cambridge for permission this year to suspend an informational banner over Massachusetts Avenue proximate to Norfolk Street and for relief of parking fees during the hours of the market's operation. We feel that such approval by the City of Cambridge will help to increase the viability of the market and its usefulness for the community.

The Cambridge farmers' market went fairly well last year due to its proximity to Central Square, the interest of the farmers in trying a new market and the visibility of the market banner on Massachusetts Avenue. The market was served by four to six local farmers and local residents' patronage increased throughout the season of the market. The market is actively encouraging community participation and ideas.

We herewith submit a petition to the City of Cambridge for suspension of an informational banner and for relief of parking fees for the purposes of the Cambridge farmers' market.
