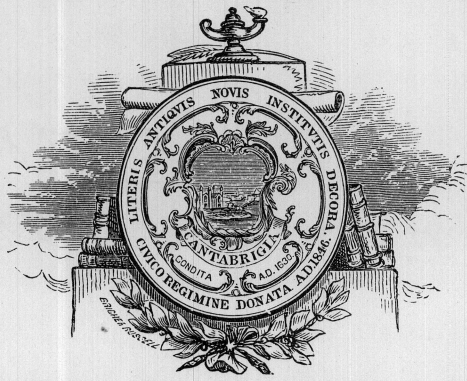

Elm street, as established by the ^{order} ~~resolve~~ aforesaid, or move and set back the same to the said line, and vacate and surrender the land and premises taken as aforesaid, on or before the 30th day of June ~~now next ensuing~~ ^{current}

And in default thereof, the Committee on Roads and Bridges are hereby directed and empowered forthwith to enter upon said land, and cause all buildings, erections, and obstructions standing on and projecting over the lines of said Elm street, as established by the ^{order} ~~resolve~~ aforesaid, to be cut off, pulled down, removed, and carried away, or sold in such manner as they shall deem expedient, or be moved and set back to said line, and the said land to be vacated and surrendered under the direction of said Committee.
