IN CITY COUNCIL

WHEREAS:

William J. Doliber, a former employee of the Fire Department of the City of Cambridge, entered the service of the Fire Department on June 2, 1929 and was pensioned on May 3, 1955 under the provisions of Chapter 32, Section 56 of the General Laws and died on December 8, 1973, having served not less than twenty-five years, and

WHEREAS:

At the time of his death said employee had no rights to elect that benefits be paid to his survivor, said employee leaves as his survivor, his widow, Mrs. Helen Doliber, who has not remarried and is not receiving any retirement allowance or pension under the provisions of any general or special law, therefore be it

ORDERED:

That under the provisions of Chapter 32, Section 101 of the General Laws, Tercentenary Edition and amendments thereto, that in order to promote the public good, and in consideration of the long and meritorious service performed by William J. Doliber, an annuity be granted to Mrs. Helen Doliber, widow of William J. Doliber, of \$1,680.00 per year as long as she does not remarry, payable to Mary Ann Herlihy, Conservator for Helen Doliber.
