WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge requires and is entitled to the best possible quality of social services to guarantee and protect the dignity, health and welfare of all its citizen; and

WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge in spirit and in law, historically has opposed discrimination in housing by statute and Executive Order; and

WHEREAS: Every person desires safe and decent housing, with an opportunity to live in peace and harmony in a community; and

WHEREAS: The goal of equality of opportunity in housing for all citizens is one that requires the cooperation, dedicated effort and assistance of public officials and agencies, private individuals, corporate institutions and community organizations; and

WHEREAS: 1996 marks the 28th anniversary of the passage of Title VIII of the 1968 Civil Right Act and the 52nd anniversary of the initial passage of prohibitions against housing discrimination under state law; and

WHEREAS: It is appropriate that residents of the City of Cambridge or "greater Cambridge area rededicate themselves to the principles of equality of opportunity and justice in housing and renew the commitment and responsibility to assist in the elimination of housing discrimination; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record that we celebrate the month of April as Fair Housing month and urge the citizens of Cambridge, to take cognizance of this event and participate fittingly in its observance.

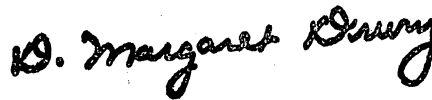
