The Committee on *Roads and Bridges,*

to which was referred ~~the petition~~ a communication from the City Engineer in relation to the culvert at the crossing of "Tannery Brook" and Tannery Street, - and recommending the removal of the same, and the building of a larger culvert, Reports,

Recommending

That although it is represented in the communication before mentioned, that the culvert in Tannery Street was built by the city, and the street filled at the time when the almshouse lands were purchased, - Tannery Street is not a public way and has never been under the care of the Street Department of this city. If this culvert was ^{and the street repaired} built by Mr. Jacob Hanscom as stated by the owners of the lands abutting on Tannery Street, the expenditure must have been paid out of the appropriation for the almshouse. In the opinion of your committee the matter of repairs upon said culvert should be referred to the officers of the Poor, and such reference is therefore recommended.
