- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Carl W. Berg, a former long time Cambridge resident and President of the Cambridge Council of Boy Scouts of America; and
- WHEREAS: Carl served his country well as a member of the United States Navy for fifteen years, working in radio communications and during World War I, he established the first naval radio station on St. Thomas, Virgin Islands where the highest hill in the town was named Berg Hill in his honor; and
- WHEREAS: Carl was an Industrial Engineer by profession, working for the Westinghouse Company and later joined the Civil Aeronautics Commission as the Engineer in charge of Radio Beacon Installations in the northeast; and
- WHEREAS: Carl served for many years as President of the Cambridge Council of Boy Scouts where he received several honors, including the Beaver Award and only recently was presented an award for fifty consecutive years of scouting service, service which has inspired many people to consider Carl as "Mr. Boy Scout"; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Gladys Berg and to the entire family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Berg on behalf of the entire City Council.
