Ordered:

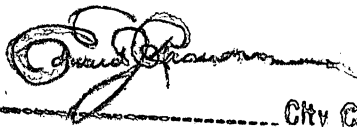

Estates benefitted to be assessed according to law.

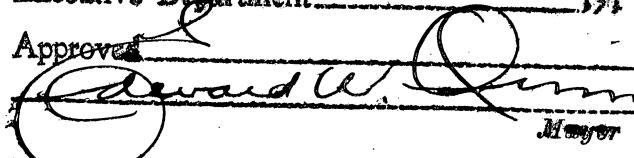
In Highland Avenue from Cambridge St. to Broadway

about 900 feet in length.

In Maple Avenue from Cambridge St. to Broadway about
1100 feet in length.

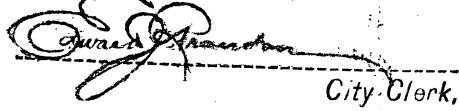

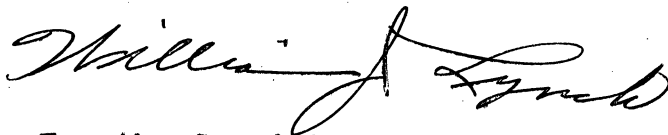
