Richard Slattery, a nuclear physicist

Richard E. Slattery of Littleton, a former nuclear physicist at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and a former board member of Massachusetts Municipal Wholesale Electric Co., died Wednesday in his home. He was 76.

Mr. Slattery was born in New York City. He graduated from high school and joined the Army during World War II. He completed graduate work at Harvard University in 1948 and received his doctorate from the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor.

Mr. Slattery worked as a nuclear physicist for MIT's Lincoln Labs for 35 years. He was also Littleton's light and water commissioner for many years.

From 1987 to 1993 he was director, president, and chairman of the board of Massachusetts Municipal Wholesale Electric Co., the power supply and financing agency of the state's municipal utilities.

Mr. Slattery served on several of the company's key committees, including a task force that saved consumers about \$800 million in power costs through its management of a multiyear debt refunding program. He also provided leadership in the development of the company's business, financial, regulatory, and legislative strategies.

Mr. Slattery served on the Littleton School Committee for several years and was a member of the Blue Water Sailing Club.

He leaves a son, Lawrence of Walden, N.Y.; a daughter, Annie Dempsey of Littleton; three grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren.
