WHEREAS: October 24, 1991 marks the completion of the first phase of the Cambridge Community Housing, Inc.'s rehabilitation of the Portland/Marcella Apartments; and

WHEREAS: This project is not only the rejuvenation of an owner-abandoned property and a new home for nine low-income families, but also an example of the positive collaboration among local banks, city government, and a non-profit developer, Cambridge Community Housing, Inc.; and

WHEREAS: The financing for this endeavor has also been a cooperative effort involving the Cambridge Affordable Housing Trust; consortium of Cambridge banks including Cambridge Savings Bank, Cambridge Trust Company, Cambridgeport Savings Bank, and East Cambridge Savings Bank; the Neighborhood Reinvestment Corporation; Cambridge Community Development Department; EOCD; HUD; and the Cambridge Historical Commission; and

WHEREAS: In these troubled times of dwindling funds and increasing homelessness, the opening of housing for nine families is indeed cause for celebration; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council congratulates all parties involved in the Portland/Marcella Apartments Project; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation to Cambridge Community Housing on October 24, 1991.
