WHEREAS: All City Councillors support the Core Mission of the Cambridge City Hospital to provide quality care to all Cambridge residents regardless of their ability to pay; and

WHEREAS: The expenses of operating the hospital make it difficult for the taxpayers to be sure their money is directed for quality care; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the first available date in January that the City Council holds a public hearing at one of its regular scheduled meetings to discuss the proposed expansion, its size, its cost and to review the expenses and salaries at the Cambridge City Hospital so that this Council can better understand what the taxpayers may face in future obligations in order to continue to support the Core Mission of the hospital, namely to provide quality care to Cambridge residents regardless of their ability to pay.
