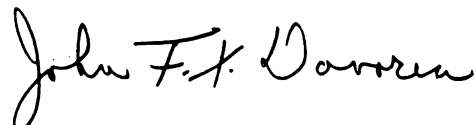

1. The name by which the corporation shall be known is:

The Academy at Taunton, Incorporated ✓

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

a. To sponsor programs and events such as concerts, recitals, lectures, symposia, conferences, dramatic performances, art exhibitions, and other similar activities for the enrichment and stimulation of the intellectual, cultural, and educational life of the greater Taunton, Massachusetts, area.

b. To cooperate with already existing educational and cultural institutions in the greater Taunton, Massachusetts, area to help them supplement, expand, and develop their services and programs.

c. To establish, maintain, and regulate an institution offering education at the junior high school, senior high school, and junior college levels in the greater Taunton, Massachusetts, area.

d. To conduct research and to disseminate reports and other publications dealing with the structure, methods, subject matter, and other educational problems of both traditional and innovative approaches to schooling.

e. To cooperate voluntarily and without gain or profit with other organizations, associations, corporations, and individuals whose purposes are consonant with or similar to the purposes herein stated.

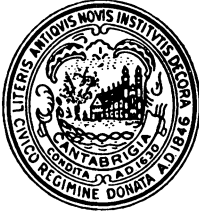
f. To acquire by grant, devise, gift, purchase, bequest or otherwise any real or personal property, and hold, enjoy and dispose of the same, and deal with it in such a manner as in the judgment of Convocation will best promote the educational and cultural objectives of the Corporation. Article 2A

g. To carry out the aforesaid purposes without pecuniary gain, benefit, or profit to the members, and in such a way that no officer, member, agent, or employee of the corporation shall receive any pecuniary profit from the operation thereof except reasonable compensation for actual services rendered in effecting one or more of the stated purposes.

h. No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall be devoted to propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, or in participating in or intervening in any political campaign or on behalf of any candidate for public office.

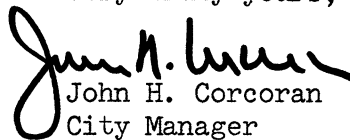
