- WHEREAS: The Massachusetts Easter Seal Society has been providing services to handicapped children and adults since 1944, and
- WHEREAS: The Easter Seal Society delivers direct therapeutic and rehabilitative services that provide practical and immediate benefits to handicapped individuals, and
- WHEREAS: In Massachusetts alone they offer programs at 37 recreational and rehabilitative facilities, including summer camps, provide therapists to agencies unable to afford their own, pioneer in the development of job-training and placement for handicapped, initiate programs to remove architectural barriers and the development of pilot programs, and
- WHEREAS: The Easter Seal Society depends primarily on contributions and volunteer participation, now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That I, Alfred E. Vellucci, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, urge the citizens of Cambridge and all Cambridge employees to support this agency, and be it further
- RESOLVED: That I urge all to watch the Easter Seal's Telethon '77 and pledge their help so that this organization can continue and expand their indispensable services.
